



- Weighted Grade: A = 5.0 not 4.0
- IB course(s) on transcript is attractive to universities
- IB tests w/ high scores can earn college credit at many universities

Credit Models for IB Diploma



- A la carte credits for individual exams
- Additional general education credits for IB Diploma earners, regardless of composite Diploma score
- Credit with an overall score of 30 points or more (45 credit hours) at Oregon Public Universities
- IB Diploma earners: possible scholarship money and other enticements

Levels of Engagement:

Certificate v. Full Diploma



IB Student:

- Takes 1-5 IB classes as stand-alone IB classes.
- Student chooses not to test.
- IB Coursework shows on the MHS transcript and may be helpful for college admission.

IB CERTIFICATE Student:

- Takes 1-5 IB classes as stand-alone IB classes.
- Tests in one or more of those IB classes.
- College credit may be awarded for certain scores on IB exams.

IB FULL DIPLOMA Student:

- Completes all aspects of the full diploma including TOK, CAS, and Extended Essay, with tests in May of senior year.
- College credit will/may be awarded for certain score on the IB Diploma.

The IB Core

- Theory of Knowledge Course
- CAS: ongoing experiences over the course of 18 months
- Extended Essay: 4000 word essay on subject of student's choice

What Role Does CAS Play in the IB Program?



Creativity: exploring and extending ideas leading to an original or interpretive product or performance

Activity: physical exertion contributing to a healthy lifestyle

Service: engagement with the community in response to an authentic need

- Starts September of Junior year
- Students log experiences across these three categories that address 7 learning targets
- CAS is the embodiment of the IB Learner Profile
- Students can use CAS service hours toward MHS community service requirement

What Role Does EE Play in the IB Program?



The Extended Essay is an in-depth study of a focused topic chosen from the list of available Diploma Programme subjects. This is normally one of your six chosen subjects. The EE promotes:

- academic research skills
- structured writing skills
- reflective opportunities
- engagement in personal research in a topic of a student's choice

Basically, the extended essay is an independent, self-directed formal piece of sustained academic writing containing no more than 4,000 words accompanied by a reflection form of no more than 500 words.





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OR State Recognition for IB



- OR state law requires <u>public</u> universities to award credit for SL and HL exams with a score of 4+ or provide evidence for denial of credit (effective Fall 2020)
- Most colleges award credit for HL exams with a score of 5+
- Some colleges recognize SL exam scores
- Credit awards range from 3-5 semester credits to 45 quarter credits depending on credentials, results, and university choice.

IB Diploma Requirements



- 24 points minimum on 6 subjects
- 12 points minimum total on 3 HL subjects
- Bonus points available for ToK and EE
- Successful completion of CAS
- Must pass ToK, EE, and CAS

How are IB scores calculated?



- Internal assessments (IA) by teacher
- External assessment (EA) by IB
- Each subject has its own % total
- Students MUST complete IA on time
- IA & EA scores are moderated by IB
- Scores are on a 1-7 scale
- Examiners are worldwide
